Minutes

The Town of Champion Town Board met in regular monthly session on Monday, April 7, 2008 at the Town of Champion Municipal Building, 10 North Broad Street, West Carthage. Present were Supervisor Buckley, Councilmen Stewart, Watkins(7:06pm), Buzzell, and Peck(7:11pm), Attorney Farley, and Highway Superintendent Sech.

Supervisor Buckley called the meeting to order at 7:00pm and opened the meeting for public comment. Bruce Rounds, West Carthage, distributed a letter to the Board requesting action to increase the maximum exemption for veterans, combat veterans and disabled veterans as adopted by the Jefferson County Legislature. He stated that he believes the current exemption level has been devalued by the increases in assessed values. Supervisor Buckley responded that exempted values contribute to a significant increase in the tax rate paid by all property owners. The Board will consider the impact of the proposed exemption increase during its budget deliberations.

Monthly Reports

- Councilmen Mr. Watkins reported that he had received information from Brookfield Power relative to their filings with FERC (Federal Energy Regulatory Commission). Mr. Peck reported on the activities of the Farmland Protection Board.
- Highway Mr. Sech submitted his monthly report. The highway department purchased 2200T of salt for the 2007-08 winter season as compared to 1700T in the 2006-07 season. Mr. Sech reported that an unauthorized dam has been erected on Mosher Road and that the roadway is being undermined. The Board directed the Highway Superintendent to meet with the Town Attorney and to forward a notice of violation to the property owner. A letter has been received from NYSDOT informing the Town that the State will make an adjustment for salt and fuel costs incurred by the Town. Supervisor Buckley reported that he has received numerous calls from residents of County Route 47 regarding displaced gravel from the road shoulders. Supervisor Buckley asked Mr. Sech to contact the County Highway Superintendent to request that the affected yards be restored. The Board requested that the Highway Superintendent coordinate a road inspection on Friday, May 9, 2008 at 1:00pm with the County Highway Department.
- Assessor Mr. Vargulick responded to Board questions.
- Circuit Rider Ms. Amyot shared issues of local interest.
- Engineer Mr. Dimmick reported that the Board has taken significant steps to advance Water Districts No. 5 & 6. Pre-eligibility applications were submitted to USDA-RUS for both districts on March 25th. NYS DOH has been contacted in regards to letter of need for the districts. Dave Miller, USDA-RUS, has agreed to construction under a single piping contract. Discussions are proceeding between the Town and the Joint Village Utility Board for the purchase/sale of water. Design documents will be ready for review in May. Supervisor Buckley stated that he is cautiously optimistic that a bid may be awarded by late June.

Motion by Mr. Peck, seconded by Mr. Stewart to approve the minutes of March 3, March 17 and March 24, 2008 as presented. Ayes-5, Nays-0. Motion carried.

RESOLVED AND DETERMINED:

That the Town Clerk be and hereby is authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this Order in the Jefferson County Clerk's Office and in the Office of the New York State Comptroller pursuant to the provisions of Section 195 of the Town Law and shall publish this Order pursuant to Article 12-A of the Town Law subject to a permissive referendum. Roll call vote: Mr. Stewart-aye, Mr. Watkins-aye, Mr. Buzzell-aye, Mr. Peck-aye, and Supervisor Buckley-aye. Resolution adopted.

- Resolution offered by Mr. Stewart, seconded by Mr. Peck authorizing the construction of a water distribution system to be known as Town of Champion Water District #5 area and authorizing the issuance of a maximum of \$650,000 in serial bonds of said town to pay the cost thereof. Roll call vote: Mr. Stewart-aye, Mr. Watkinsaye, Mr. Buzzell-aye, Mr. Peck-aye, and Supervisor Buckley-aye. Resolution adopted subject to permissive referendum.
- Resolution offered by Mr. Buzzell, seconded by Mr. Stewart authorizing the construction of a water
 distribution system to be known as Town of Champion Water District #6 area and authorizing the issuance of
 a maximum of \$870,000 in serial bonds of said town to pay the cost thereof. Roll call vote: Mr. Stewart-aye,
 Mr. Watkins-aye, Mr. Buzzell-aye, Mr. Peck-aye, and Supervisor Buckley-aye. Resolution adopted subject to
 permissive referendum.
- Supervisor Buckley recommended the following persons for appointment to the Board of Ethics: Samuel C. Emerson, Lynn A. Murray, and Henry S. Watkins. Motion by Mr. Buzzell, seconded by Mr. Peck to appoint Samuel C. Emerson, Lynn A. Murray, and Henry S. Watkins to the Board of Ethics and to request that the members review the adopted Code in conjunction with model ethics codes and recommend amendments as deemed necessary. H. Watkins discussed concerns regarding the "officer member" making decisions relative to action they may be party to. Mr. Watkins proposes that guidelines be established that position the Board to issue directives rather than act a punitive body. Board members concurred. Ayes-5, Nays-0. Motion carried.
- Motion by Mr. Buzzell, seconded by Mr. Stewart to recognize those employees belonging to the NYS Retirement System, their retirement numbers and their number of days worked during a bi-weekly pay period. Ayes-5, Nays-0. Motion carried.
- Resolution offered by Mr. Stewart, seconded by Mr. Peck that the Town of Champion opposes any effort to eliminate citizens local and convenient access to the Tax Collector; and That the Town of Champion finds that the local presence of the Tax Collector provides a meaningful and necessary presence within our community and ensures the continued safety of our taxpayers' dollars; and That the Town Board of the Town of Champion is overwhelmingly opposed to any amendment to the Real Property Tax Law, General Municipal Law, Town Law, and Education Law that would remove the statutory impediments for the consolidation of local government tax collection functions including eliminating elected tax collectors in towns and making these offices appointed; and

That the Town Board of the Town of Champion is opposed to the governor's proposal to dispense with the requirement that town tax collecting officers be town residents; and That the Town Board of the Town of Champion is opposed to any measures that would create bigger, more costly government which is less convenient, and lacking in the personal service that is currently provided by local tax collectors. Ayes-5, Nays-0. Resolution adopted.
